ESTABLISHMENT OF KRCT

Pioneered trauma-informed psychosocial support in Kosovo, laying the foundation for a national model of survivor rehabilitation where none previously existed.

2002

INTERNATIONAL HUMAN RIGHTS COMMITMENT

Reinforced Kosovo's commitment to human rights by helping advance the Declaration recognizing the UN Convention against Torture.

FIRST RESEARCH STUDY ON WAR CONSEQUENCES

First research study on war's long-term impact, shaping understanding of survivors' psychological, social, and economic recovery needs.

2006 - 2011

ESTABLISHMENT OF THE HUMAN RIGHTS AND ADVOCACY SECTOR



- KRCT's Human Rights and Advocacy Sector was established to drive legal reform and policy change.
- KRCT started monitoring the rights of persons deprived of their liberty in prisons, police and mental health and social care institutions.
- KRCT initiated the process of establishing the **National Preventive Mechanism** against Torture, organizing the first conference (2009) and becoming part of the Steering Committee (2011).
- 15 Annual Reports with recommendations from prison monitoring have been published, increasing national standards and becoming a reference for international human rights mechanisms.

2012 ADVOCACY FOR LEGAL RECOGNITION

Launched the "Hear My Voice" campaign, securing the first dialogue between CRSV survivors and the government to advance their legal recognition.

2013–2014 LEGAL RECOGNITION AND NATIONAL INSTITUTIONAL FRAMEWORK

Achieved legal recognition and reparations rights for CRSV survivors through the 2013–2014 amendment of Law No. 04/L-172, marking a historic milestone in Kosovo's justice framework.

2015-2018 STRENGTHENING LEGAL SUPPORT @ ADVOCACY IMPACT

- Feride Rushiti is honored by the US State Department with the International "Women of Courage" Award.
- KRCT's advocacy secured the establishment of the Government Commission, a dedicated state budget, and the start of CRSV survivors' legal recognition process.
- The "Be My Voice" campaign further amplified survivors' voices and advanced justice and dignity.
- Vasfije Krasniqi became the first survivor to publicly share her experiences of wartime sexual violence, breaking the silence and raising national awareness.

2019 – 2021ADVANCING JUSTICE ® RESEARCH ON TRAUMA

- Shyrete Tahiri, a wartime sexual violence survivor, publicly filed a criminal complaint with Kosovo's Special Prosecutor, seeking justice for the crimes she suffered.
- KRCT built the first platform for documenting wartime sexual violence crimes.
- The first case of someone being convicted of sexual violence during the war in Kosovo, where KRCT supported the victim at all stages of the judicial process.
- KRCT led the first epigenetic study on transgenerational trauma.

2022

KRCT organized the international conference on the Kosovo-Denmark Agreement for the lease of the Gjilan Prison, presenting recommendations and global practices.

2023

After 9 years of legal representation, a prisoner won the right to compensation for sexual violence that he suffered in Dubraya Prison.

2023

ADVANCING SURVIVOR RECOGNITION AND RIGHTS

- 14 April 2023 officially recognize as the Memorial Day that honor survivors of wartime sexual violence in Kosovo and raise national awareness.
- 2023 KRCT advocacy **extended the application deadline by 2+2 years**, enabling more survivors to access their rights until 15 May 2027.

2024

KRCT 25th ANNIVERSARY – ADVANCING RIGHTS, CHANGING LIVES

- KRCT marked its 25th anniversary by hosting an international conference on conflict-related sexual violence, uniting survivors, experts, and institutions to drive justice and survivor-centered policies.
- Women survivors supported with tailored grants to boost economic independence and aid psychological recovery through home-based businesses.
- Following the advocacy of the KRCT, the Law on Mandatory Health Care Insurance was adopted, which guarantees free and unconditional health care to survivors of sexual violence of the war.

2025 ADVANCING JUSTICE AND RIGHTS FOR CRSV SURVIVORS

- The Basic Court in Pristina also announced 2 more convictions, where 3 perpetrators of wartime sexual violence were sentenced to 15 years in prison each; by the support of the KRCT, which provided full legal and psychological support to the survivor, the total prison sentences for these crimes reached 58 years.
- Two new wartime sexual violence indictments filed, bringing the total to 12, most documented and prepared by KRCT.
- The Court of Appeal confirms the first case represented by the KRCT, guaranteeing the provision of double pensions for survivors of sexual violence during the war in Kosovo.
- KRCT has represented over 50 beneficiaries in court (administrative cases), and has secured compensation in the amount of over €61,000 in only 5 cases:
 - Two survivors were recognized as victims of sexual violence, one received €24,000 from 2018, while the other received €13,000 from 2021.
 - In cases of double pension, 3 survivors have received retroactive compensation in the amount of €24,600 in total
- Safe Room established in Prishtina Court to support survivors' testimony, ensuring access to justice and reducing retraumatization.

JANUARY 2025 NOBEL PEACE PRIZE NOMINATION

KRCT and Executive Director Dr. Feride Rushiti nominated for the **Nobel Peace Prize** for their decades-long commitment to CRSV survivors.

14 APRIL 2025 PUBLIC ADVOCACY BY A MALE SURVIVOR

A male survivor, Ramadan Nishore publicly shared his story for the first time, breaking silence and drawing wide public attention.
